On behalf of the Evergreen Heritage Center Foundation, our great thanks to our partners, volunteers, and community. Whether you've identified ways we can work together, given of your time or dollars, helped provide programs for our region, or simply spread the word about Evergreen, we're truly grateful.

As a farm for education, conservation, and preservation, we're dedicated to growing together and we couldn't do that without your support. In 2016, we not only expanded our program offerings, including our field trips, in and after-school programs, summer camps, teacher training, and outreach activities, but we exceeded our goals:

- 6,874 children, youth, and adults were served through our programs and activities
- Students participating in our middle and high school field trips increased their science literacy by 28-52% per class (per pre/ post-tests)
- Students participating in our 3rd and 5th grade Arts in the Schools program (provided in partnership with the Allegany Arts Council) increased their art literacy by 24-44% per class (per pre/post-tests)
- Kindergarten students participating in our Garden Discovery program increased their consumption of vegetables by 11% and fruits by 44% (per pre/post parent surveys)

We hope you will join us for our Garden Fair & Father's Day Celebration on June 18th from 1 to 4pm. In addition to a host of activities, we'll be raffling off TWO summer camp weeks for kids and TWO rounds of golf. We'd welcome the chance to personally thank you for being part of our Evergreen family.

Garden Fair & Father's Day Celebration

Have you ever wondered why your plants won't grow when your neighbor's garden flourishes? Are you curious about taking your garden off the grid using solar? Or are you ready to race your child or grandchild in a vegetable-themed obstacle course? If so, our Garden Fair and Father's Day Celebration is your place to be on Sunday, June 18th from 1 to 4 pm. The event is free and open to all.

Evergreen will offer free soil testing*; native plants and produce (grown by the Mt Savage 4-H Club) for purchase; an "ask the gardener" booth; and tours of its gardens, green houses, museum, and 18th century barn. In celebration of Father's Day, Evergreen will host activities for children and their parents, including a garden craft activity from recycled products, hands-on cooking demonstrations, a storytelling tent, and vegetable obstacle course. Evergreen will raffle off two weeks of Summer Camps, valued at \$90-150 each.

*Providing a soil sample for testing is easy but requires a small amount of preparation. Evergreen asks that you provide a mixed sample from five spots in your garden. Simply, dig a hole seven inches deep and scoop a small amount into a flower pot. Repeat this action four more times placing each sample in the same pot. Stir the soil together and scoop a half cup of soil into a sealed container or sandwich bag.
