## From Sea to Sky!

On November 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>, the Frostburg State University Cultural Event Series and the Evergreen Heritage Center partnered to provide an educational enrichment program for Western Maryland elementary school children. First the children watched the play, *The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane*, a story about a cold-hearted china rabbit who travels on an odyssey spanning decades while gaining a heart. Then the students participated in a 90-minute adventure from *Sea to Sky*, sponsored in part by the Maryland Arts Council, Frostburg State University (FSU) Cultural Event Series, and the Evergreen Heritage Center (EHC) Foundation. As part of this post-play adventure, students participated in a dance improv session “under the sea” that was conducted by Mountain City Center for the Arts. EHC instructors then taught the children how to navigate using the constellations and how to create three-dimensional renderings of the rabbit Edward Tulane before and after his journey.
